
Message From Friends' President Roger Parr

2020 ORGANIZATION OVERVIEW

Although we were disappointed to be unable to hold public programs this year, one positive outcome for our organization during the 2020 pandemic was making new friends. As more people visited the park, a number of folks joined the Friends, volunteered and/or sent gifts in appreciation of our work.

New Initiatives: Over the past two decades, the Friends have focused in large measure on park infrastructure development---trails, kiosks, maps, shelters. With these elements well established by 2019, the Friends made a major financial commitment to supporting two ecological restoration initiatives---a 30-acre grassland restoration project in the southwest section of the park and development of a Forest Management Plan. Work on these projects continued through 2020, in partnership with Dane County Parks and Adaptive Restoration.

The Friends ended the year with 90 members, an operating budget balance of \$58,035.26 and \$127,613.45 in the endowment fund at Madison Community Foundation. We held our Annual Meeting with good attendance on January 21 in the lovely meeting facilities of the Mt. Horeb Driftless Historium, before pandemic restrictions were in place. The popular Donald Dash Trail Run, a major fundraiser for the Friends, had to be called off but many runners stepped forward to donate their entry fees, so that we were still able to realize \$3,900 from this event and race organizer Greg Wiegand's efforts were not in vain. And throughout this challenging year, our dedicated volunteers continued with many tasks behind the scenes.

Bluebird Restoration Project

Thank you to the great group of volunteers that join me in keeping the bluebird nesting boxes monitored (2 trails, 32 boxes): Susan Eisele, Aimee and Steve Gauger, Katie Haag, Barb Hartman, Sharon Hughes, Liz McBride, John Shaw, Jenny Sievert and Gail Van Haren. The issue we noticed this year was the wrens that showed up. We thought house sparrows were going to be the problem but instead, wrens tripled their presence from 2019. Bluebirds had 60 fledglings and wrens had 56! We also had 22 tree swallows.

Why the concern about the cute little wren? First, they are very aggressive. They show up about the time the bluebird has laid eggs; wrens pitch the eggs out or poke holes in them. They do not let up fighting for nest boxes! Tree swallows also give way to wrens. So what can we do? This coming year we will move some nesting boxes away from the overgrown, brushy areas which wrens love. Thanks again to all our volunteers who make the bluebird trails happen---and to those bluebirds, who brighten the skies at Donald Park!



Grassland Bird Survey: The Friends contracted with Kevin Thusius, Ice Age Trail Alliance Director of Land Conservation, to establish a repeatable methodology for counting breeding grassland birds in the Grassland Restoration Project area (see above, New Initiatives). Kevin's spring counts documented meadowlarks and bluebirds. This work continues in 2021 and beyond with counts by citizen scientists, to look for changes in grassland bird populations as a result of the restoration work we are supporting.



Kestrel Nest Boxes: A project through Madison Audubon to establish kestrel nest boxes has been on-going at the park for several years, with boxes at the Hwy G entrance (removed in fall 2020) and just off Sutter Drive, south of the parking lot. The Friends began working with Patrick Ready, Jill Stevenson and Finn Rotherburg in 2020 to learn more about their work in this regard and will be reporting on the project in our 2021 newsletters.


Horse Trails

The 2020 riding season at Donald Park saw a large increase in horse traffic. It seems the time away from our work gave us time to spend with our horses and nature. With the increase in visitors to Donald Park, equestrians also had a much larger chance to encounter hikers on the trail. We stressed to equestrians that we're all there to enjoy the trails and many of the hikers aren't sure how to act when they come upon horses. We reminded equestrians that when encountering walkers, ask them to speak out so the horses know what they are and ask them to hold their dog (if they have one) as horses pass by---and thank them, it's everyone's park!

A bad thing about the health restrictions was that we were not able to have any workdays and we have a lot to be done on the park trails. Please see the insert page for ways equestrians can help with trails in 2021.

As always, many thanks to Jean Warrior for all the time and effort she devotes to selling trail passes. This year she sold 120 passes, with \$2,147 going to the Friends. This money helps with trail maintenance costs, including all mowing of the outside-the-park trails.

Natural Areas and Trails

Due to the pandemic, the Tuesday natural areas volunteer group shut down operations for a period in spring and again in late fall, although some individuals still came by to repair and maintain equipment (always an on-going task). When our dedicated crew was working, they spent a lot of time with the new walk-behind brush hog, keeping all the hiking trails widened. They also removed brush on Donald Rock and cleared brush from around many of the stately oaks near Pop's Knoll. The crew repaired a number of spots on trails where water was a problem and constructed a short wooden bridge to enable access to the Prairie Experience trail near Larson Pond, which had become impassable due to water flowage. We have been very pleased to see so many people out enjoying and benefitting from the park, and we very much look forward to resuming our regular work in spring 2021!

Outreach and Education

Pandemic precautions caused the Friends to suspend public programs for a year---the spring Maple Syrup demo, annual Bring Your Pop to Pop's Knoll Father's Day picnic and August Stargazing. We also removed all brochures from the kiosk map boxes at the three trailheads and directed visitors to our website to download a park map. Visitors navigated trails successfully, thanks in large measure to the signage system we put in place several years ago.

We installed two interpretive panels, bringing the total number of panels at the park to 13. *Early Native Peoples* at the entrance to the Little Spring site details human activity in the area going back thousands of years. *Two Visionary Women* profiles park co-founders Delma Donald Woodburn and Pat Hitchcock; the panel was placed at the Hwy G trailhead to provide information about early park history to the increasing numbers of hikers and equestrians that use this entrance (another *Two Visionary Women* panel is at Pop's Knoll).
